Scot.E3 is just into its third year a campaigning group. A few of us, trade unionists in construction and defence and climate activists got together in Autumn 2017 to make a submission to the Scottish Government's Energy consultation. The experience led us to think there was a space for a group focusing on climate justice and climate jobs and aiming to take the arguments about the climate crisis into the unions at grass roots level and into working class communities and campaigns. We saw this as complementary to the work done by Friends of the Earth Scotland and others working with the Scottish Trades Union Congress.

In the last two years we have produced resources, designed to provoke debate and to be used, reused, and adapted by others. We've held meetings, often in partnership with other organisations and responded to requests to speak at events. This is our second conference.
